**Contents:** Love, the supreme gift of the **SPIRIT**, and its governing power over other gifts.

Characters: Paul.

**Conclusion:** Love alone can give value to any service rendered in **CHRIST**'s name, and it is therefore the supreme gift of the **SPIRIT**, to be coveted and prayed for above all other "Gifts of the **SPIRIT**". Faith trusts and appropriates, hope expects, but love expresses **CHRIST** and blesses all of humanity.

**Striking Facts:** *JESUS CHRIST* is the supreme expression of the love of *GOD* and *HIS* divine love and compassion is the gift of the *SPIRIT* to believers who will be yielded to *HIM*. Thinking of *JESUS* as "love" (for *GOD* is love<sup>ii</sup>) substitute the name *JESUS* in place of "love" and notice the force of the text. Can you say "*CHRIST* lives in me?"
