shem shame

A primitive word (perhaps rather from H7760 through the idea of definite and conspicuous position; compare H8064); an appellation, **as a mark or memorial of individuality**; by implication honor, authority, character: - + base, [in-] fame [-ous], name (-d), renown, report.

sum siym soom, seem

A primitive root; to put (used in a great variety of applications, **literally, figuratively**, **inferentially**ⁱⁱ and **elliptically**ⁱⁱⁱ): - X any wise, appoint, bring, call [a name], care, cast in, change, charge, commit, consider, convey, determine, + disguise, dispose, do, get, give, heap up, hold, impute, lay (down, up), leave, look, make (out), mark, + name, X on, ordain, order, + paint, place, preserve, purpose, put (on), + regard, rehearse, reward, (cause to) set (on, up), shew, + stedfastly, take, X tell, + tread down, ([over-]) turn, X wholly, work.

shamayim shameh shaw-mah'-yim, shaw-meh'

The second form being dual of an unused singular; from an *unused root meaning to be lofty*; the sky (as aloft; the dual perhaps alluding to the visible arch in which the clouds move, as well as to the higher ether where the celestial bodies revolve): - air, X astrologer, heaven (-s).

Primary Scripture: Proverbs 10:7 The memory of the righteous *is* blessed, But the name of the wicked will rot.

- **Psalms 112:6** Surely he will never be shaken; The righteous will be in everlasting remembrance.
- **Ecclesiates 2:16** For there is no more remembrance of the wise than of the fool forever, Since all that now is will be forgotten in the days to come. And how does a wise man die? As the fool!

ⁱ **Figuratively** - Aside from meaning not literally or not in a literal sense, figuratively means involving a figure of speech or of nature of in the English language. The word also refers to a hyperbolic meaning or symbolic meaning of a term or phrase. **Example: Strong as an ox!**

inferentially - Inferential is an adjective that describes something that relates to, involves, or resembles inference. Inference is a process of reasoning that deduces or derives a conclusion from general premises. Inferential can also refer to something that is based on inference, such as evidence or information.

iii Elliptically - which is a figure of speech that omits some words or information.
