Contents: Deliverance for Israel through the Passover.

Characters: GOD, Moses, Aaron, Pharaoh.

Conclusion: Deliverance for the believer is based entirely upon the shedding of the blood of a divinely appointed substitute and its application to the heart one time in history for the benefit of all mankind, past, present and future, who accept **JESUS** as the **MESSIAH**. If death occurs BEFORE we accept JESUS, we have permanently lost that privelege.

Strong Verses: 2, 13, 14, 27.

Striking Facts: 8. Secured by the blood, the believer feeds on the **PERSON OF THE LAMB** of **GOD**, roast with fire, not raw (without the grace of the shed blood of **CHRIST**). If **CHRIST** is not seen as the **ONE** subjected to the fires of **GOD**'s wrath against sin, we cannot feed upon **HIM (as in the Passover). HE** cannot be an example to us of the grace of **GOD**, if **HE** is not first an atoning sacrifice.
