
Lintel - a horizontal support of timber, stone, concrete, or steel across the top of a door or window.





phylactery (Tefillin) [See Exodus 13:16]

- 1. <u>Tefillin</u>, leather boxes containing Torah verses worn by some Jews when praying.
- 2. An <u>amulet</u> or <u>charm</u>, worn for its supposed magical or supernatural power.
- 3. A <u>speech scroll</u> in medieval art, which contains or represents speech.





Reliquary - a container or shrine in which sacred relics are kept.
