Contents: *JESUS* announces *HIMSELF LORD OF SABBATH*. Controversy with Pharisees. Healing of the man's withered hand. A demoniac healed. The unpardonable sin. Death and resurrection foretold. Deficiency of self-reformation. *JESUS*' new relationships.

Characters: *JESUS*, *HOLY SPIRIT*, Pharisees, disciples, man with a withered hand, satan, David, Jonah, Queen of the South.
