Matthew Chapter 16 Instructor

Contents: *JESUS*' rebuke of the blinded Pharisees. The symbol of leaven interpreted. Peter's confession of the deity of *JESUS*. *JESUS* foretells His death and resurrection.

Characters: GOD, JESUS, Peter, satan, disciples, John the Baptist, Elias(Elijah), Jeremiah.

Conclusion: *JESUS* is the *SON* of *GOD*, the foundation stone of the church. He died for the sin of the world, arose for the justification of the believer and is coming back in glory to reward His own. The cross of Calvary was *GOD*'s preexistent plan for the salvation of mankind and all attempts to prevent *GOD*'s plan were satan-inspired. This is also true of the denials of its necessity today. **Key Words: Deity** 16, **Death** 21, **Resurrection** 4, 21, **Descent** 27).

Strong Verses: 15, 24, 26.

Striking Facts: 17, 18. *JESUS* is teaching that the church was to be built <u>NOT</u> upon Peter but upon Peter's confession of who <u>HE</u> is! also compare 1 Peter 2:4-9). The focus is not on Peter, but to his confession.

The deity of **CHRIST** is **the** *foundational doctrine* of Christianity.

Word Study:

Petros (Pet'-*ros*) **G4074** Apparently a primary word; a (**piece of**) *rock* (larger than G3037); as a name, *Petrus*, an apostle: - Peter, rock. Compare G2786. Petra (P*et'-ra*) Feminine form of the same as G4074; a (**mass of**) *rock* (literally or figuratively): - rock.
