Contents: Warning against neglecting the great revelation of salvation. The Earth is under *CHRIST*. *JESUS* was *temporarily* lower than angels to work out salvation for man.

Characters: GOD, CHRIST, HOLY SPIRIT, satan, Abraham.

Conclusion: The salvation provided by **JESUS CHRIST** is so great a salvation that none can express or conceive immensity. The salvation introduces a great **SAVIOR** who manifested **GOD** to mankind despite our sinful natures which made us unable to reconcile ourselves. **HE** was made, for a time, lower than angels, that **HE** might humble **HIM**self unto death for our sakes. The fullness of the **GOD**head dwelling in **HIM** and **HIS** suffering was sufficient for the satisfaction of all of mankind's sin (past, present and future), thereby making salvation possible to all. Rejecting this salvation, therefore is the worst of crime against **GOD**.

Striking Facts: 17, 18. **CHRIST, who is GOD,** became a mortal man that **HE** might die, because as **GOD HE** could not die, therefore **HE** <u>assumed</u> another nature (which was not sinful, but had many of man's limitations). To be a perfect **SAVIOR** of mankind, **HE** must in every way take man's place being proven perfect(complete) under *all* conditions, and as a result of being "**THE PERFECT ONE**, bear our sins. Because of **HIS** sufferings as a man, **HE** is made a merciful High Priest, in every way qualified to succor **HIS** people.
