Contents: The attempted coup by Miriam and Aaron.

Characters: GOD, Moses, Aaron, Miriam.

Conclusion: Challenging the leaders that **GOD** chooses carries many consequences, "When those leaders are following GOD's instructions". See I Timothy 5:17-21.

Key Word: Criticism, (speaking against), 1.

Strong Verses: 3, 8.

Striking Facts: There are timess when it is decidedly out of place to criticize the leaders of the people. This affront was ill-natured and ill-timed, especially when the people were already disobeying. Additionally, it added to the leader's [Moses'] burden caring for the people.

Word Study:

coup – (/ko \overline{o} /) a sudden, violent, and $\underline{unlawful\ seizure}$ of power from a government.

Audacity - a willingness to take bold risks. rude or disrespectful behavior.

Questions:

- 5. Why was GOD "surprised" at Aaron and Miriam's audacity? (Verses 7-8)
- 6. What was Miriam's punishment? (Verses 10, 14)

Bonus Question: Is it **GOD**ly to challenge **GOD**'s chosen leaders? Why didn't Aaron get punished here?
