Student

Contents: Warning against mixture of law and grace. Danger of tasting the **SPIRIT**'s work in grace and then going back to ceremonies.

Characters: **CHRIST, GOD, HOLY SPIRIT**, Abraham, Melchisedec.

Conclusion: Those who have understood and accepted to grace of **CHRIST**'s salvation, being clearly convicted by the **HOLY SPIRIT** and were fully enlightened by the **WORD OF GOD** as to the way of life, should not return to the dead works of false titles and ceremonies. This behavior shames the grace of **CHRIST**. This behavior prevents true fellowship with **CHRIST** which can only be renewed by to repentance and acceptance of the **HOLY SPIRIT**. The true believer takes refuge wholly in the finished work of **CHRIST**. This refuge creates a sure hope behavior which leads to **CHRIST**.

Key Word: Dead works, 1.

Strong Verses: 10, 18, 19.

Striking Facts: 4-6. These verses do not apply to backsliders, it states that there is no restoration possible after having once fallen away. The reference is to Hebrews "fully enlightened" in the prophecies about **CHRIST**, and having seen **HIS** work in your life would prevent you from rejecting the revelation of **CHRIST**. If one is persuaded to believe in false titles and ceremonies, there was no further conviction. Verse 9 shows that this cannot occur to a **true believer**, one who has "received" (**truly believed**). Having "tasted", one is "sealed by the **SPIRIT**," not merely a "spectator" in His illuminating work. **See Psalms 34:8.**
